Subject : Credit of sale proceeds of tender forms to the National Highway works.

In supersession of this Ministry's circular letter of even number dated the 11th July, 1984, I am directed to state that on receipt of representations from various State PWDs regarding expenditure on account of printing of tender forms including the cost of paper, printing and publicity etc., the whole matter has been carefully examined. It has been decided that, in future, the cost of printing of tender forms including the cost of paper, printing and publicity etc. may be charged to National Highway project and accordingly the sale proceeds of tender forms may be credited to NH funds.

2. In this connection, attention is invited to policy circular No. RW/NHIII/P/4/82 dated 21.8.1985 regarding invitation of tenders for the execution of works on National Highways and oher Centrally financed schemes. The procedure laid down in para 3.1, 3.2 and 3.3 regarding advertisement for such works may be scrupulously followed. For minor works costing upto Rs. 10.00 lakhs the advertisements may be issued in two regional papers — (one printed in English and the other in local language). For works costing above Rs. 10 lakhs and upto Rs. 50 lakhs, advertisement may be issued in two regional papers (one in English and the other in Hindi), the Indian Trade Journal and two regional papers (one in English and the other in local language).
