The undersigned is directed to intimate that the Ministry is intending/planning to facilitate State Govts./UTs to take up construction of ROBs/RUBs on (except on village roads/ roads considered under PMGSY Scheme and Projects Sanctioned under Budget Head of M/o Railways and M/o Rural Development) in replacement of existing level crossing. The cost of construction is intended to be fully funded from the appropriate budget head of this Ministry. Land Acquisition and Utility Shifting of these projects are proposed to be carried out by the concerned State Govts./UTs from their own resources.

- The overall objective of this is to reduce the accidents at such locations and 2. enhance road safety with funding from States'/UTs' share of CRIF cess.
- It is being intended to allocate funds for these projects through earmarking of additional outlay for States/UTs under CRIF Schemes depending upon such eligible projects to be taken up in States/UTs. Separate account is proposed to be maintained for these projects. The proposal is presently at consultation stage within the Government.
- An MOU prepared accordingly in consultation with the M/o Railways is enclosed herewith (Annexure-I), the main features of which are as follows: -
 - Land acquisition and utility shifting to be done by State Govts./UTs from (i) their own resources.
 - (ii) Construction cost to be met from separate outlay under CRIF which is to be provided separately by the Ministry.
 - (iii) Construction of ROBs/RUBs and approaches to be done by State Govts./UTs and work of ROB/RUBs proper (Railway Portion) to be carried out under the supervision of Railways.

- (iv) Railways to be responsible for maintenance of bridge structure of Railway Span with its own funds excluding approaches and roadways.
- Approaches including road of ROBs/RUBs to be maintained by the State Govts./UTs from their own resources.
- (vi) No way leave charges to be levied by Railways.
- (vii) The funds for these works to be without affecting the funding to M/o Railways for removal of LCs and ROBs/RUBs works from CRIF.
- 5. State Govts./UTs are requested to specifically convey their acceptance of the MOU which is eventually to be accepted/signed amongst this Ministry, M/o Railways and concerned State Govt./UT.
- State Govts./ UTs are also requested to separately furnish the State/UT-wise 6. details of existing level crossing on State Roads (except for village roads/ roads considered under PMGSY Scheme and Projects Sanctioned under Budget Head of M/o Railways and M/o Rural Development) to be replaced by ROBs/RUBs under the proposed programme with reference to the Ministry's OM under ref. as per Format at Annexure-II. This Memorandum of Understanding is executed at Delhi on ___October, 2021

BETWEEN

The President of India exercising executive powers of the Government of India represented by Secretary, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways having office at Transport Bhawan, No.1, Parliament Street, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as MoRTH) (which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to include his executors, administers and official assigns) of the First Part;

AND

The President of India exercising executive powers of the Government of India represented by Chairman, Railway Board, Ministry of Railways, having office at Rail Bhawan, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as MoR) which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to include his executors, administers and official assigns) of the Second Part;

AND

The Governor/ Lieutenant Governor of the State/ Union Territory (UT) of exercising executive powers of the Government/ UT of represented by the Chief Secretary (hereinafter referred to as Government of States'/ UTs') (which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to include his executors, administers and official assigns) of the Third Part.

I. OBJECTIVE

1. Level Crossings (LCs) in India have been the major crossing point of rail/ road accidents. LCs not only generate the risk of accidents but also create inconvenience for passengers by slowing down traffic. There are approximately (______) level crossings in the State/ UT of ______ itself. The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, Government of India and the Government/ UT of ______ are desirous of eliminating critical level crossings to ensure a safe and seamless travel. Any additional nos. of level crossings

may be considered in same conditions as per this agreement.
2. The Public Works Department/ Road Construction Department/, Government/ UT of, maintains the State roads through its own resources. An extensive and wide network of railways exist in These Railway Lines cross the existing road network at many places. Priority is given to Railway traffic and, hence, when a Railway crosses the junction of a road and rail, the road traffic is halted for particular time duration. At a few places the road traffic is regulated by manned level crossings and there exist unmanned level crossings at few places on State roads. Many accidents have occurred in the past due to negligent and hasty behaviour of road commuters and drivers on these LCs.
3. Safety of the road users is of paramount concern and is given due importance by Government/ UT of and the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways. The Hon. Supreme Court has also directed to form road safety cell and have underlined the importance of replacement of manned/ unmanned level crossings by Road Over Bridges (ROBs)/ Road Under Bridges (RUBs). Hence, it is necessary to construct ROBs and RUBs for the safe and smooth operation of vehicular traffic at such LCs.
II. METHODOLOGY FOR EXECUTION
1. The Public Works Department/ Road Construction Department/ Government of, would accordingly make an exhaustive list of all the ROBs/ RUBs across the State/ UT of to ensure that all the railway crossings in are serviced by ROBs/ RUBs.
2. Only future ROBs/ RUBs projects involving closure of LCs on State Roads will be considered for handing over for execution under this MOU. Any variation/ modification in ROB/ RUB features and execution planning, etc. will be mutually agreed.
III. OBLIGATION AND DUTIES OF THE STAKEHOLDERS
I. Whereas the issue of construction of ROBs/ RUBs on various LCs on the State roads is extremely important for smooth vehicular movement and safety on road traffic is of itmost importance, the present MOU is being signed by Government/ UT of

(i) The Government/UT of hereby agrees to fully acquire land
under the scope of the instant MOU from its own resources, which is necessary for replacement of existing LCs by ROBs/ RUBs on all State roads (except Village Roads and roads considered under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY)).
(ii) The Government/ UT of hereby agrees to also carry out for shifting of utilities in the acquired land from its own resources.
(iii) The Government/ UT of hereby agrees that cost of construction of such ROBs/ RUBs shall be met from Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF) accruals to the State Government/ UT of, for which MoRTH shall earmark separate outlay annually apart from the accruals made for the State/ UT of for State Roads under the CRIF Scheme.
(iv) The work of ROBs/ RUBs, including approaches, will be carried out by the Government/ UT of and the work of ROBs/ RUBs proper (Railway Portion) will be carried out under the supervision of Railways.
(v) The Railways administration shall be responsible only for the maintenance of bridges structure of Railway Span with its own funds excluding the approaches and road way.
(vi) The approaches including road of the ROBs/ RUBs shall be maintained by State Government/ UT of from its own resources.
(vii) No way leave charges will be levied by Railways.
(viii) The funds for these works will be without affecting the funding to MoR for removal of LCs and ROBs/ RUBs works from CRIF. The proposed agreement between MoRTH, MoR and State Government/ UT is subject to this stipulation about funding. IV. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECTS UNDER MOU
1. The Public Works Department/ Road Construction Department/, Government/ UT of, will act as the implementing agency for the execution of these ROBs/ RUBs.
2. Combined GAD (Railway Portion and Approaches) shall be approved by Railways before commencement of work.

V. GENERAL

- 1. All the additions, supplements, amendments on variations to this MOU shall be in writing as agreed to by the parties and shall be jointly signed by the duly authorised representatives of the parties.
- 2. In case of any difference of opinion between MoRTH, MoR and Government of States'/ UTs' in the implementation of this MOU, the same shall be resolved amicably through mutual discussions.

The undersigned is directed to enclose herewith following statements showing State/UT - wise allocation/accrual of funds for State Roads and separate allocation/accrual for ROBs/ RUBs/Bridges on State roads under Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF) (State Road) scheme during 2022-23, as per the following procedure.

- 2. The allowable release of funds for State roads to a particular State/UT would be calculated based on the UC received against the funds released, upto one third of the provisional accrual during 2022-23 subject to the maximum release upto 60% of the provisional accrual during 2022-23, as per the Annexure-I.
- 3. As the allocation/accrual of funds for ROBs/RUBs/Bridges on State roads under Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF) (State Road) scheme has been started during current Financial Year 2022-23, as per the Annexure-II. Therefore, the allowable release of first installment of funds for ROBs/ RUBs/ Bridges on State roads to a particular State/UT would be calculated based on the minimum of (a) one-third of annual accrual or (b) amount of list of works of ROBs/RUBs/Bridges finalized in Ministry, subject to maximum release upto 60% of the annual accrual with following conditions: -
 - (i) Acceptance of MOU (Ref. letter dated 25.10.2021 (copy enclosed) requested to all States/UTs for acceptance of draft MOU prepared in consultation with M/o Railways) for proposed implementation of ROBs/RUBs of State Roads under CRIF scheme by State Government/ UT.
 - (ii) List of works for ROBs/ RUBs/ Bridges on State Roads for the States/ UTs are finalized by the Ministry.

All subsequent release of funds shall be made based on UCs received as per extant policy.

The undersigned is directed to refer to the amendments to the Central Road Fund (CRF) Act, 2000 through the Finance Act, 2018 to the Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF) Act, 2000 and its subsequent amendments vide the Finance Act, 2019, repeal of the CRF (State Roads) Rules, 2014 vide Gazette Notification under ref. No. (i) above, and draw your kind attention to the following related developments:

- (i) Vide Gazette Notification under Ref. (ii) dated 26.07.2018 the Government of India (Allocation of Business), Rules, 1961 was amended and the subject CRIF was assigned to Department of Economic Affairs (DEA), Ministry of Finance (MoF). Accordingly, DEA is responsible now for administering the CRIF Act, 2000.
- (ii) The DEA constituted the Committee under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Finance Minister vide Gazette Notification under Ref. (iii) dated 02.07.2018, as per Section 7A of CRIF Act, 2000. A Sub-Committee headed by the Secretary (DEA) was also constituted vide the above-mentioned Gazette Notification.
- (iii) As requested by DEA the draft Criteria for allocation of funds for development of State Roads under the CRIF Act, 2000 was referred by the Ministry to DEA.
- The criteria for allocation of funds for development of State Roads under the CRIF Act, 2000, duly approved by the DEA, are enclosed herewith. These



criteria shall be followed henceforth with immediate effects and until further orders for all State Road works under the CRF/ CRIF Scheme including Economic Importance and Inter State Connectivity Schemes (EL& ISC).

Criteria for allocation of funds for development of State Roads under the Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF) Act, 2000.

- These Criteria shall be applicable for State road projects under Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF) with immediate effect and until further orders.
- Allocation of Fund: -
- The Central Government shall allocate funds for development of State roads under (1) ERIF based on the decision taken by the Committee headed by the Finance Minister as per Section 7 A & Section 11 of the CRIF Act, 2000.
- Broad criteria for such allocation of funds shall be as follows: -
 - (i) The allocation of fund shall be made on the basis of 30% weightage to fuel consumption and 70% weightage to the geographical area of the concerned States/ UTs.

Out of the fund thus allocated to the State Governments/ LTs, 10% of the fund shall be earmarked for road safety works.

The Central Government may earmark part of the fund (earmarked for road safety works) for other works under the scheme depending upon progress

- Funds shall be allocated for States/ UTs Annually and released in Quarterly Instalments linked to submission of Utilization Certificates as per the following
- (i) Allocation/ release of funds towards taking up new works and other projects to be
- Considering the limited available budgetary resources, aspirations of the Government to develop State road networks in the second phase after completion of the Phase I of Bharatmala, financing of such State road projects under CRIF shall have to be
- Fund requirement on account of outstanding liability of works sanctioned by the MoRTeH under CRIF (including Economic Importance & Inter-State Connectivity (El&ISC) Schemes) shall be set eside to meet the fund requirement for such projects.
- Construction of roads connecting 'economic corridors', 'connecting roads under Bharatmala', 'roads connecting ports' and 'roads connecting commercial hubs' shall be
- One third of the allocation for the current year for each State/ UT shall be released to the concerned State/ UT by MoRT&H from budget earmarked for State road projects under appropriate budget head of the MoRT&H for utilisation against the sanctioned works, as per the Monthly/Quarterly Expenditure Plan and the said amount shall be maintained as a reserve by replenishing the expenditure from subsequent
- The subsequent instalments shall be released by MoRT&H on the basis of the (vi) progress of works and actual expenditure subject to the condition that the total amount released for any State/ UT during the year shall not exceed
 - (a) the total allocation for that year in respect of such State/ UT, and
 - (b) the amount which has not been released from allocation of previous years.

- (vii) Further if in any case, the complaint about the poor quality of roads developed by the State Governments/ UTs under these schemes are received, the funds under CRIF equal to the amount of sanction of the works against which complaint has been received shall be withheld. The fund, thus withheld, shall be released only upon rectification of defects.
- (viii) The State Government/ UTs shall submit the utilisation certificate (UC) in Form-I annexed to these guidelines and shall also submit quarterly progress report in Form-II annexed to these guidelines for the amount released, duly considering observation report, if any, from the person appointed under the quality monitoring system. Such UC along with quarterly progress report shall be submitted by the State Government/ UTs electronically within 15 days of quarter end to the MoRF&H.
- (ix) The State Governments/ UTs shall further retease such amounts to the concerned executive agency (e.g. Public Works Department, Road Construction Department/ Corporation, etc.) every quarter within 7 (seven) days of such release of funds by the Central Government.
- (x) In all these cases, the overall availability of budget provision shall be the determining factor for allocations and the payments shall be regulated accordingly.
- 3. Utilisation of Fund in respect of projects, schemes and activities: Subject to the provisions as per section 7 of the CRIF Act, 2000, the Fund shall be utilised for projects, schemes or activities relating to the construction and development of State Roads including road safety works, which are to be identified in accordance with para 4.
- Identification and prioritisation of State roads projects under CRIF Scheme;
- (1) The State Governments/ UTs shall identify and prioritise the projects for release of Funds as per the criteria and furnish necessary details of the projects, as specified under these guidelines, to the Central Government.
- (2) Projects on State Roads shall be considered including section of NHs denotified/ reverted back to States/ UTs on account of construction of NH bypasses, potential roads which are considered as important from the perspective of declaration as new NHs, inter-State roads and roads which are economically important for the State(s), roads connecting NHs with particular focus on safety aspects, traffic calming measures, etc.

Due consideration shall be given for road safety works, construction of ROBs/RUBs, bridges, etc.

- 5. Criteria for selection of Schemes: -
- (1) The types of works to be considered in the Scheme: -
 - construction or rehabilitation of cross drainage works, widening or strengthening of roads, improvements to road geometrics;
 - engineering aspects of road safety works covering improvement of traffic junctions, road marking, signalling, construction of subways and over-bridges including ROBs and RUBs, construction of parking, lay-byes, bus sheds, traffic calming measures and the like;
 - (iii) construction of bypasses, parallel service roads along National/ State Highways;
 - (iv) pre-construction activities for ring-roads or bypasses or service roads along National Highways;
- (2) The proposals shall cover sufficient length of road and shall generally be covering at least ten kilometres length, unless the requirement for connecting two places is less than ten kilometres in so far as works mentioned in sub-para (1) are concerned, and shall include only those works where land is available without any encumbrance except for

works mentioned in sr. no. (iv) of sub-para (1) above. However, land acquisition shall be allowed for development of NHs as States'/ LITs' contributions to share of Land Costs

- The State Governments / UTs shall make available to the Central Governmentalist of projects to be taken up, which shall be shown on the State road map indicating district bdundaries, National Highways, State Highways, major district roads, rural roads or other types of roads in different colours, in addition to the roads atready approved under the
- The detailing of proposed projects in the State/ UT shall include-(4)
 - the name of the work and districts;
 - index map showing the area and the proposed road or bridge or improvement works;
 - the roads approved "in-Principle" as NHs which have not been notified as
 - category of the road proposed to be improved whether the State highway or (iv) major district road:
 - scope of the work including the specifications to be adopted in briefs (v)
 - (vi) length;
 - estimated cost of the project based on the actual requirement and realistic (vii) cost estimate:
 - (viii) justification of work for inclusion in the scheme along with details of last improvement works done on the road and the calendar year in which ft was carried out;
 - (ix) probable starting date;
 - target date of completion; (x)
 - a certificate regarding availability of the entire unencumbered land needed (xi) for the project:
 - a certificate that the concerned State Government or Union territory shall (xii) ensure taking up proper Maintenance and Repair (M&R) of the project roads after it is developed under this scheme;
 - (xiii) details of previous approved ongoing projects.
- Approval and financing of schemes;
- The State Government/ UTs shall forward the identified individual works along with the details as per sub-para (3) & (4) of para 5 to the MoRT&H for consideration of finalizing the same.
- (2) The State Governments/ UTs shall accord Administrative Approval for such projects included in the list of projects finalized by the MoRT&H for the specified costs.
- (3) The rechnical approval and financial sanction (TA & FS) of the work shall be accorded by the executive agency concerned (e.g. Public Works Department, Road Construction Department/ Corporation, etc.) in the State Government/ UT and there shall not be any change in scope of work from those as per administrative approval.
- The executive agency concerned in the State Government/ UT shall ensure that individual project is technically approved, financially sanctioned within a period of four months from the date of administrative approval of the work failing which the work shall be deemed to have been de-sanctioned, unless the executive agency concerned obtained prior approval of the State Government/ UT granting extension of validity of the administrative approval.

- (5) The details of the sanction of the work referred to in sub-para (3) and abstract of cost estimate of the sanctioned works shall be forwarded to the Central Government along with the application for reimbursement.
- (6) No excess cost beyond 10% of the amount administratively approved for the proposal shall be permissible.
- (7) The specifications for roads proposed under CRIF scheme shall be similar to those of National Highways works to the extent of pavement width, crust thickness and geometrics.
- (8) The standard design and specification of the works shall follow the relevant guidelines, codes, Indian Roads Congress specifications and the period of completion of projects shall not exceed 36 months for hill States, North East states and 24 months for other States unless permitted by the State Government/UT.
- (9) The estimates for land acquisition shall be allowed for development of NHs as States'? UTs' contributions to share of Land Costs. However, estimates for land acquisition shall not be considered for any other projects except for items referred to sr. no. (iv) of sub-para (1) of para 5 and the executive agency in the State? UT shall render a certificate to the effect to the State Government? UT concerned that land is available for road development and is in its possession and removing of utilities, if any, has been completed for such roads.
- (10) The total cost of the schemes to be approved shall be limited to the bank of sanctions which shall generally be three times of the annual allocation except for bill States and North-East States where working season is limited and for these States, the bank of sanctions shall generally be four times of the annual allocation for the year in which the schemes are sanctioned in respect of any State or Union territory.
- (11) Additional financial implications, if any, beyond the entitled fund allocation as perpara 2 (2) shall be fully borne by the concerned State Government/ UT.
- (12) The estimate for each work shall include provisions for-
 - (a) 3% towards contingency;
 - (b) 1% for meeting the cost of devising and operation of a Quality Assurance System, quality control and monitoring of the works by a State Quality Monitor, and training of the state's officials in quality awareness by the executing agency;
 - (c) 0.5% towards work charged establishment,
- (13) The agency charges shall not be payable for execution of works under the scheme.
- (14) The sanctioned works generally shall be completed within the time schedule as submitted along with the particulars referred to in sub-para (4) of para 5.
- (15) In all these cases, the overall availability of budget provision shall be the determining factor for allocations and the payments shall be regulated accordingly.
- (16) It shall be mandatory to record Inventory and condition of Road using Network Survey. Vehicle (NSV) at least before start of work, before issue of provisional completion/completion certificate, and 6 months after completion of work; however, for State Highways (SHs), urban roads and urban bypass roads, the data shall be updated thereafter once every year. The data to be captured are:
 - (i) Road Inventory GPS coordinates, Pavement Type, Pavement Width, Terrain, Land use, Shoulder type and width, Drain Type and Width, Median Type (if any) and Width, Wayside Amenities (if any), Crash barrier, Signages etc.
 - (ii) Condition of Road Roughness, Rutting, Distresses (cracking, Potholes, Bleeding, Surface failure etc.);

All items shall be recorded both side of road and Geo-tagged with images.

The above data shall facilitate ranking of State roads to cover attributes such as condition, quality, etc.

- The executive agency shall, for the implementation of all the projects sanctioned under the Fund, observe that

 - the project monitoring and quality control of the works shall be done at regular interval in a methodical manner by adopting the following procedure
 - (i) the measurements shall be checked by the officers of executive agency to the extent specified in the relevant Manual or Code;
 - (ii) there should be a quality monitoring system at the State Level or Union territory level, consisting of such experts and supporting staff as may be appointed by the State Government/ UT, including State Quality Monitor;

The President of India exercising executive powers of the Government of India represented by Secretary, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways having office at Transport Bhawan, 1. Parliament Street, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as/MoRTH) (which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to include his executors, administers and official assigns) of the First Part;

AND

The President of India exercising executive powers of the Government of India represented by Chairman, Railway Board, Ministry of Railways, having office at Rail Bhawan, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as MoR) which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to include his executors, administers and official assigns) of the Second Part;

AND

The Governor/ Lieutenant Governor of the State/ Union Territory (UT) of exercising executive powers of the Government/ UT of represented by the (Principal Chief Secretary) Public Works Department/ Road Construction Department/ (hereinafter referred to as Government of States'/ UTs') (which expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to include his executors, administers b official assigns.

I. OBJECTIVE

- 1. Level Crossings (LCs) in India have been the major crossing point of rail/road accidents. Level Crossings not only generate the risk of accidents but also create inconvenience for passengers by slowing down traffic. There are approximately () level crossings in the State/UT of itself. The Ministry of Road Transport &. Highways, Government of India and the Government / UT of are desirous of eliminating critical level crossings to ensure a safe and seamless travel.

1	the junction of a road and rail, the road traffic is halted for particular time duration. At a few places the road traffic is regulated by manned level crossings and there exist unmanned level crossings in many at few, places on State roads. Many accidents have occurred in the past due to negligent and hasty behavior of road commuters and drivers on these level crossings.
	3. Safety o the road users is of paramount concern and is given due importance by Government/ UT of and the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways. The Hon. Supreme Court has also directed to form road safety cell and have underlined the importance of replacement or manned/ unmanned level crossings by Road Over Bridges (ROBs)/ Road Under Bridges (RUBs). Hence, it is necessary to construct ROBs and RUBs for the safe and smooth operation of vehicular traffic at such level crossings.

	III. OBLIGATION AND DUTIES OF THE STAKEHOLDERS
1	Whereas the issue of construction of ROBs/ RUBs on various Les on the state roads is extremely important for smooth vehicular movement and safety on road traffic is of utmost importance, the present MOU is being signed by Government / UT of and the Government of India to regulate the procedure of approval and provision of resources as follows.
1	i) The Government/ UT of hereby agrees to fully acquire land under of the scope of the instant MOU from its own resources, which is necessary for replacement of existing LCs by ROBs/ RUBs on all State roads (except Village Roads).
(ii) The Government/ UT of hereby agrees to also carry out for shifting of utilities in the acquired land from its own resources.

(iii) The Government/ UT of hereby agrees that cost of construction of such ROBs / RUBS shall be met from Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIE) accruals to the state Government/UT of, for which MoRTH shall earmark separate outlay annualy apart from the accruals made for the State/ UT of for State Roads under the CRIF Scheme.
(iv) The work of ROBs/ RUBs, including approaches, will be carried out by the Government/ UT of and the work of ROBs/ RUBS proper (Railway Portion) will be carried out under the supervision of Railways.
(v) The Railways administration shall be responsible only for the maintenance of bridges structure of Railway Span with its own funds excluding the approaches and road way.
(vi) The approaches including road of the ROBs / RUBs shall be maintained by State Government/UT of, from its own resources.
(vii) No way leave charges will be levied by Railways.
(viii) The funds for these works will without affecting the funding to MoR for removal of LCs and ROB and RUB works from CRIF. The proposed agreement between MoR, MoRTH and state Govt is subject to this stipulation about funding.
IV. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROJECTS UNDER MOU
1. The Public Works Department/ Road Construction Department/, Government/ UT of will act as the implementing agency for the execution of these ROBs/ RUBs.
2. Combined GAD (Railway Portion and Approaches) shall be approved by Railways before commencement of work.
